


3. After Cleanup

- 1. Household junk, furniture (fees apply for mattresses/box springs)
- 2. Yard debris: leaves, trimmings, small branches
- 3. Dried paint cans (must be completely dry)

Not Allowed:

- 1. Electronics, batteries, food waste
- 2. Hazardous materials, wet paint, concrete, dirt, bricks
